## Purpose and Terms of Reference

Friends of the Alliance is a body established by and recognised in the Constitution of the National Rural Health Alliance. The organisation welcomes individual members as well as small and large organisations. The Alliance provides Friends with information, connections, discounted Conference fees and special updates about Alliance activities.

  The usual term for Committee members is two years, with the option to nominate for subsequent terms. Elections for State and Territory representatives take
- representatives are appointed at CouncilFest. State and Territory representatives are elected from within the membership of Friends by the members in each particular jurisdiction. In determining eligibility no distinction will be drawn between those who are individual members and those who are from an organisation.

  If a State/Territory is under-represented (such as insufficient nominations or
- a mid-term resignation), a financial member from that jurisdiction may be appointed by the Committee to fill the vacancy.
  The Chair of Friends is elected by the FAC from within its membership, and serves as a member of Council of the Alliance for the duration of the term.

- Members of the FAC are normally expected to cover the costs of their involvement. A face-to-face meeting of Friends Advisory Committee is held at each National Rural Health Conference.
